## FIFTY LONDON CABS FOR BAHRAIN

50 black cabs are now on the streets of Bahrain, operated by the Arabian Taxi Company. These are the first of an order of two hundred that LTI Vehicles in Coventry are supplying. The new taxi service is the result of a joint initiative between Bahrain Development Bank (BDB) and the Economic Development Board (EDB).

EDB chief executive Sheikh Mohammed bin Essa Al Khalifa said: “Bahrain is improving the quality of services delivered to Bahrainis, residents and visitors in order to build a better

lifestyle. The new company will work on raising the standards of our taxi services. The Bahrain Development Bank will help any group of



licence owners who satisfy the criteria and want to establish their own cab company to come forward to modernise the taxi sector.”

Arabian Taxi imported 200 London-style cabs, which passengers will be to hail on the street, order through a call centre or pick them up at stations around Bahrain. It is designed in white with a black and white chequered roof. The metered cabs are fitted with Global Positioning System technology and connected electronically to a control centre.
